We are excited to share with you the schematic plans for what is in store for our residents and team members.



Earlier this year, in our neighborhood in Newark, my son who lives with me and helps care for his siblings—was a victim of gun violence during a drive-by shooting.

The incident left him legally blind in one eye and in need of a glass eye. After a few months on disability, his insurance ran out and as a single mother, I was in desperate need of money to cover his medical expenses. I read the FellowshipLIFE Foundation's global email to all team members that the application period for the **TEAM MEMBER CRISIS FUND** was open to apply, so I immediately applied.

I am grateful the Foundation Board of Directors approved the funding for my son's glass eye. Betty Jo was a brilliant and successful person in her own right. She was proud of almost single-handedly saving a company from bankruptcy. She also managed the finances of an organization that would now be called a CCRC, served as a liaison in the space program, and took an active role in various social organizations--all the while managing to maintain a comfortable home.



Notwithstanding all of her accomplishments, Betty Jo often preferred to work behind the scenes, and never received the recognition she deserved during her lifetime.

How You Can Plan for Impactful Planned Gifts to FellowshipLIFE Foundation?

The recent changes in the economy has opened doors for opportunities to those who wish to leave a planned gift such as **QCDs and noncash gifts of real estate.**

Qualified Charitable Distribution (also known as QCD) is related to individual retirement accounts (IRA's), not specifically for planed gifts of estate, is a distribution from an individual retirement account (IRA) that goes directly to a qualified charity. This distribution can count toward the required minimum distribution (RMD) for the account holder.

WHAT IS A QCD?

For Example:

If you have an IRA and you are at the age where you're required to take a minimum withdrawal, a QCD allows you to send a portion of that money directly to a charity without it being counted as taxable income. It's a way to support a cause you care about while potentially reducing your taxable income.

A Qualified Charitable Distribution is a way for individuals who are 73 years old or older to donate money directly from their IRA to a qualified charity.

- **1) Age Requirement:** To do a QCD, you need to be at least 73 years old or older. This is the age at which the government requires you to start taking money out of your traditional IRA.
- **2) IRA Involvement:** Instead of taking the required minimum distribution (RMD) from your IRA and then donating it to charity, a QCD allows you to send the money directly from your IRA to the qualified charity.
- **3) Tax Advantages:** The direct transfer of funds from your IRA to a charity is beneficial for tax purposes. The amount you donate through a QCD can be excluded from your taxable income, potentially reducing your overall tax bill. This is particularly advantageous for those who don't need the full amount of their Required Minimum Distribution for expenses.
- **4) Limits and Conditions:** There are limits on the amount you can donate through a QCD each year, typically capped at \$100,000. Additionally, the charity must be a qualified tax-exempt organization for the donation to qualify.

Now, how does this tie into estate planning?

- Estate Reduction: If you have a significant IRA and you don't need the full RMD amount for your living expenses, using a QCD can help reduce the size of your taxable estate. This could have potential estate tax benefits.
- **Philanthropy:** If you have charitable intentions, a QCD allows you to support your favorite causes directly from your IRA. It's a way to align your charitable goals with your retirement planning.

In Summary:

A Qualified Charitable Donation is a tax-efficient way for individuals of a certain age to donate money from their IRA directly to charity, potentially reducing their taxable income and benefiting their estate planning strategy. Always consult with a tax professional or financial advisor to understand how this applies to your specific situation.
